F. We believe in both the resurrection of the saved and the lost; they that are saved to the resurrection of life and they that are lost to the resurrection of damnation. Phil. 1:21-23; Acts 24:15; I Cor. 15; Rev. 20:1-6; II Cor. 5:8; John 5:28,29
Phil. 1:21-23 "... to die is gain; ...to die and be with Christ"; 2 Cor. 5:2,8 Acts 24:15 "And I have hope toward God, which they themselves also allow, that there shall be a resurrection of *the*dead, both of the just and unjust."

I Cor. 15:12-26; 35-58 vs.13 But if there is no resurrection of the dead, neither has Christ been raised. 14 And if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation is worthless, and your faith is also worthless. 52 in a moment, in a glance of an eye, at the last trumpet. For a trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall all be changed.

Rev. 20:1-6 vs.6 Blessed and holy *is* he who has part in the first resurrection. The second death has no authority over these, but they will be priests of God and of Christ, and will reign with Him a thousand years.

II Cor. 5:8 then we are confident and we are pleased rather to go away from home out of the body, and to come home to the Lord.

John 5:28,29 Do not marvel at this, for the hour is coming in which all who are in the graves shall hear His voice, 29 and shall come forth, those who have done good to the resurrection of life, and those who have practiced evil to the resurrection of condemnation.
