## THOUGHTS ON THE LORD'S TABLE I Corinthians 11:23 FBC-PC 10-6-13 AM

The Three-Fold Meaning of the Lord's Supper The Lord's Supper is:

- 1. a reminder of what Jesus did in the past,
- 2. a symbol of our present relationship with him, and
- 3. a promise of what he will do in the future.

The Lord's Table or Communion grew out of the Jewish Passover celebration on the night before Christ's crucifixion.

- ORIGINATION Jesus started it as a church ordinance Himself Matt. 26:26-30; Mark. 14:22-26; Luke 22:14-23
- OBLIGATION Mat. 26:27 "this do"; "all...do it" = "all of you, drink of it" Quality not quantity

## PARTICIPATION -

WHO - Baptized, obedient, forgiven children of God HOW OFTEN - I Cor. 11:26 "as often" IN WHAT MANNER - I Cor. 11:27-30; cautious, repentant, confessing

CONSTITUTION - unleavened bread (matzo) and fruit of the vine Luke 22:17-20.

Four cups were poured and drunk during and after the Passover meal. Jesus gave new purpose to cup 3 and cup 4 see Luke 22:17 and 20

INTERPRETATION - three basic beliefs practiced in Christendom

Transubstantiation - Practiced by Roman Catholics John 6:53-58 is

misunderstood as Jesus was with them at that moment and they were
eating the matzo. Belief that upon being blessed by a priest bread
and wine actually become the body and blood of Christ.

Consubstantiation - Practiced by Lutherans, Anglicans - Believe the body is present in spirit, at the moment the bread and cup are partaken of.

Symbolism - "In remembrance of me" Luke 22:19; I Cor. 11:24-25 Our Practice

LIMITATION - "till He come" I Cor. 11:25-26
